DISTRICT BUSINESS

Meeting Minutes

The minutes of the June meeting were approved as written. Motion made by Torrey and seconded by Buddy. Passed.

Financial Report

Donald reviewed the financial report and noted he was pleased with receiving the report in advance of the meeting. Torrey commented she liked the new format and commended Lisa for the work it took to enter all the FY09 account information. Torrey motioned to approve the report and Ron seconded. Passed.

251 Report

Garry discussed the different solar farms in Cumberland County and a mining project in Stow Creek Township. Buddy motioned to approve the report and Torrey seconded. Passed.

SSCC

John wanted to highlight three items: the E-Permit MOA, the finance committee suggestions, and the annual conference. The E-Permit MOA does not contain any fee breakdown for distribution. Procedures are needed for inspections and reporting. After October 1, paper RFA applications submitted to the districts are to be returned.

The finance committee is seeking supplemental funding for the SSCC. They analyzed the SSCC staff and assigned percentages of each person's work on the Chapter 251 program. Their suggestions

Freehold. The registration fee is \$90.
Since the supervisors discussed the NJ DEP Memorandum of Understanding they decided to act on the approval. Torrey motioned and Donald seconded to approve the NJ DEP Memorandum of Understanding. Passed.

NRCS

MaryBeth distributed the Cumberland report and presented two items for approval: a new contract, conservation plan and state application for the CREP program and an application for additional funds for repair of a completed project. Torrey motioned and Buddy seconded to approve the signatures. Passed. Between meetings several items were approved: a state cost share application, a WHIP conservation plan, a SAFE conservation plan and two new cooperators.

Three GRP applications were withdrawn. For 2010, 47 applications were received between the EQIP, AMA, and WHIP programs. For CSP, it's a 5-year contract and involves acreage allocation. The average payment will be about \$18 per acre. The cut-off will be September 30. It is a continuous sign-up with the next cut-off on January 14, 2010.

The NRCS state office has a vacancy for Assistant State Conservationist for Operations.

An upcoming Technology Workshop will feature a stop at Centerton Nursery. The workshop will originate in Avalon.

The Salem report was distributed and included a CREP conservation plan for signature. Torrey motioned and Ron seconded to approve the plan. Passed.

Also noted was a breach in Lower Alloways Creek Township on the Alloway Creek behind the Wood farm. The county and LAC Township will work together in repairing the breach.

John noted several items of interest: (1) the EPA has signed new limitation rules which will impact NJ's RFA program, (2) comments are requested for fertilizer regulation; this is a result of a bill sponsored by Burzichelli and relates to soil testing, compaction, and health, (3) supervisors need to submit their training needs surveys, (4) no changes have occurred for the budget; the Department of Ag. still needs to trim \$849,000 by December 1, and (5) the Standards are expiring and must be readopted in 2011; meetings are being scheduled to prepare in advance of that date.

MaryBeth presented one item for signature: a state cost share application for livestock watering. Donald motioned and Ron seconded to approve the application. Passed.

MaryBeth noted a state cost share payment request had been signed between meetings.

Vineland NRCS has completed a state cost share waterway and structure. They are not ranking yet because the program schedule is off. The State Cost Share Schedule may need review. A payment request contains proposals that are higher than the schedule. A Watson Dike meeting was held November 20. No action has taken place in the last three years and the issue is heading back to the drawing board for alternatives. CSP public meetings are being held with one in Woodstown on December 2.

The Woodstown office had three items for signature: a CREP conservation plan and the remaining items were CREP payment requests. Buddy motioned to approve these signatures and Ron seconded. Passed.
